# Coronavirus Disease (COVID-19) – Regulated Medical Waste and Sharps Packaging Guidance (CANADA)

**Updated March 2020**

Stericycle's Regulatory and Safety teams have been closely monitoring the outbreak of COVID-19 and have been working closely with Regulatory Agencies. Stericycle has been considering all aspects of proper management, treatment and disposal of medical waste, generated during care of COVID-19 patients, as related to both healthcare and waste workers. Health Canada has continuously updated their guidance and recently provided more clarity regarding waste management. Specifically, Health Canada states that "No special precautions are recommended; routine practices are sufficient" when handling medical waste coming from healthcare facilities treating COVID-2019 patients.

This specific guidance provided Stericycle with the needed clarity to discontinue our prior guidance on the use of specific packaging and additional labeling of regulated medical waste and sharps generated in the care of COVID-19 patients. Updated guidance is on the following page. This new guidance specifies the management of regulated medical wastes generated in areas where there are confirmed cases of COVID-19, including isolation rooms and lab areas.

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# COVID-19 Packaging Instructions

## Biomedical Waste

### (Non-Sharps Waste) Yellow Bag:

1. Dispose of regulated medical waste into yellow bag and tie off bag properly
2. Place tied bag into current regulated medical waste containers provided by Stericycle
3. Close and seal box/container; no additional marking instructions required as previously communicated

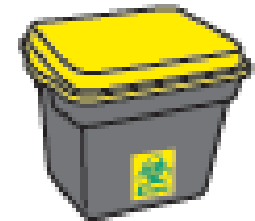


Reusable and disposable containers should be placed in the yellow bag

### Single-Use Sharps Containers and Reusable Sharps Containers (SMS/Biosystems) Service:

**Note:** Stericycle in-service technicians will not enter COVID-19 confirmed patient isolation rooms and will not change out sharps containers. Stericycle is also requiring that reusable sharps containers from COVID-19 patient rooms be disposed as follows:

## Anatomical, Cytotoxic and Pharmaceutical Waste management

Follow current, standard procedures and Stericycle's Waste Acceptance Policy.

## Laboratory Wastes

Follow current, standard procedures and Stericycle's Waste Acceptance Policy and any other additional CDC or local health department requirements.
